HALAM PARISH COUNCIL - NOTES OF THE MEETING ON THURSDAY 9TH JULY 2009

Present: S Bust, A Fraser, D Herbert, G Herbert, A Paris & M Thompson Apologies: D Parrish

Matters arising 1. Finger post at the crossroads – Cllr Andy Stewart reported that this will be fixed 2. Water on road at top end of Radley Road – Cllr Andy Stewart will progress this issue 3. Fly tipping – several incidents recently in the village. **Please be vigilant and report and suspicious activities/vehicles. Please call the District Council on 01636 655600** 4. Best Kept Village – Halam has not qualified for the next round 5. RAF Memorial (School Lane) – A Paris & T Denyer progressing Village Hall

Work is now under way. The Fire Officer will be asked to inspect once work has progressed. “Awards for All” grant of £9,000 has been applied for – should know the outcome by next Parish Council meeting. Painting of further areas inside will be completed over the summer – agreed unanimously that the Thompson boys could undertake this work (at their own risk) Conservation/Village Design Statement

Marina Thompson & Andrew Paris to prepare consultation evidence document for District Council. The District Council Conservation Officers are to be invited to the September meeting – Glenys Herbert to arrange.

1. W.I. Notice Board on bus shelter needs attention – Glenys Herbert to investigate 2. Pavements in Halam – Cllr Andy Stewart will ask Highways to investigate in association with Mrs Eleanor Bust & Tony Denyer

Correspondence

1. Regional Plan Partial Review – Andrew Paris to investigate and report back 2. Sherwood Foresters Western Front Memorial Committee – Andrew Paris to see if he can attend, otherwise invite will be passed on to others in the Parish 3. NHS Nottinghamshire Annual Public Meeting – no-one to attend, but Glenys Herbert to keep the Parish Council informed of any relevant NHS issues

Planning

1. Ford House, The Turnpike – erection of replacement dwelling with integral garage: agreed to support this application (5 for: 1 abstention) 2. Middlebeck Farm, Gray Lane – erection of replacement dwelling: agreed unanimously to reject this application; not in accordance with Policy H31 – replacement house not in keeping with size and scale of existing. The proposed new house is too tall for the site on the hill and would be too intrusive.

3. Bramley, Halam Hill – householder application for erection of front and side boundary wall: agreed unanimously to reject this application on grounds of road safety – dangerous access/poor sight lines. Wall is too tall and too intrusive. 4. Littledale Cottage Farm, The Turnpike – erection of entrance gates: agreed unanimously to support this application

Finance Open Gardens Day – cheque for £676 received. **Thank you to all who helped to make this such a successful event.** Agreed unanimously to put this money towards a replacement entrance door for the village hall
