## PARISH COUNCIL NOTES — 14TH JANUARY 2010 AT 7.30PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

**Present:** Simon Bust, Andrew Fraser, Glenys Herbert, Andrew Paris, Di Parrish & Marina Thompson **Apologies:** David Herbert

### Matters Arising:

- 1) Flooding on School Lane – Notts CC Highways will clean out the main storm drains and monitor the results
- 2) Water on the road at the top of Radley Road – being progressed with Jo Hawton from Highways

**Village Hall:** The three quotes were compared and it was decided to appoint the lowest priced – Beckett Builders – subject to a possible start date and timescale. There is still some outstanding work to be finished – Clerk to progress. It was unanimously agreed that the Clerk would be the project manager and that he would be the sole contact point with the builder. Separately, Marina Thompson to liaise with the Energy Savings Trust – visit to be arranged

**Games Night:** Need to know the building work timescale. Will be held straight after work is completed to celebrate the e-opening. Aiming for a Saturday night around the middle of April

### Planning:

1. 2. Middlebeck Farm, Gray Lane: Demolition of existing dwelling and erection of replacement dwelling – approved unanimously


## CEDRIC HALLAM 1947 - 2010

Cedric Hallam lived in Halam since 1987 - at first using Holmhurst at weekends but on retiring in 1996 moved in permanently. Cedric's family was firmly rooted in Halam. His father was born in a house on Church Lane and his mother was born at Manor Farm. His parents were married in Halam and his father entered employment in a bank in Southwell and eventually moved to Pinner in North Middlesex where Cedric was born. He was youngest of three children. The family connection with Halam was maintained through holidays in Halam regularly staying in the family home on the Turnpike with Cedric's aunts. As a boy Cedric made friends with Halam children. These years for Cedric and his brother Denzil were very happy and it was because of this that Cedric decided finally to come and live here later in life.

Cedric attended Harrow Grammar school and showed his metal when he refused to join the school cadet force; he was firmly opposed to violence. He refused to join the School scout group, and joined the Methodist scout group instead. This independence of spirit marked him out all his life. He turned down his headmaster's advice to go to Oxbridge but instead decided to join a bank like his father. He was snapped up by the Merchant Bank Samuel Montague and Co where he worked for 4 years. He switched to the Banque Nationale de Paris where he had a meteoric rise to become, by the age of 34, Head of Currency trading for the bank world-wide. He continued in this role until his early retirement at the age of 48. His position at the Bank meant that he travelled all over the world and he used this to broaden his experience – for example when he attended conferences in Australia he took the opportunity to holiday in the Cook Islands.

Cedric was a committed Christian with two principal aims: encouraging young people (he was a scoutmaster in Harrow for 20 years); and encouraging cooperation between different Christian groups - especially being involved in the ecumenical movement in Middlesex.

In 1987 his beloved aunts had died and he bought their home with the purpose of living in it himself. On moving to Halam he immersed himself in village life and in the wider community in Southwell. He encouraged the setting up of 'Churches Together' in Southwell and became involved with Southwell Methodist and Catholic Churches and St Michael's church in Halam. He gave much of his spare time to this and was widely-known and respected for his work. He became treasurer at St Michael's in Halam and always gave well-considered and confident advice. He often played the piano at the Tea at Two club in Halam and was an organist at the Methodist church in Southwell. He lived frugally at Holmhurst – the house was unaltered except for introducing a computer point. He did not own a car but walked everywhere and was the quiet and unassuming friend of many. He loved travelling to Scotland in recent years and enjoyed the companionship of his loving friend Sandra who did so much to comfort him in the last few months of life.



I had been acquainted with Cedric since 1987 but I never really knew him; I worked with him on the Parochial Church Council, and in setting up the organ fund which he successfully steered to a triumphant conclusion; I valued him for his humility, self-effacement and quiet strengths - but only now do I fully recognise the magnitude of his moral bearing, vast wisdom and intelligence, quietly living amongst us.
