**Matters Arising:** 1. State of pavements up Halam Hill – Clerk to contact Highways Dept. 2. Hedges/branches overhanging pavements & footpaths – **can all residents please check that their hedges and/or trees are not obstructing any footpaths. It is the landowners responsibility to see that any obstructions are cut back..** 3. Fallen trees at the top of Gray Lane – Clerk to contact Highways. 4. Back Lane – 'Unsuitable for Long Vehicles' Signs: County Cllr Andy Stewart to investigate. 5. Footpath bridges – all passed as safe. 6. Culvert outside Norfolk House needs clearing – Clerk to contact County Council.

**Village Hall:** It was agreed to investigate the work needed to complete toilet alterations (for disabled access) and general repairs only. Marina Thompson & the Clerk to produce and itemised list of such works needed.

**Design Statement:** Meeting to be held on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> February at 7.00pm in the village hall. **Anyone interested in helping with the Design Statement is welcome to attend.**
